I. PROGRESS REPORT

a. - Summary of main achievements

1. - Continue technical assistance to support the implementation *Community Health Plan Pilot Project of the Jinámar Valley*. Telde. Island of Gran Canaria. Spain. Execution period: 2022-2024.

The technical assistance carried out for the formulation of the Community Plan project is proposed as an organizational and participatory technology for a comprehensive, integrated, inclusive and participatory health plan model. For this, it uses as a strategy and fundamental reference, the transposition of the **Canary Islands Health Plan 2016** to the territory of the *basic health zone* within the scope of the **Integral Plan of the Jinámar Valley**, as it beganbefore in the municipality of Santa Brígida in 2018. It has a population of 27,093 inhabitants with high rates of poverty and job insecurity, and is currently in a pilot stage that is being developed in a small sector of 2.174 inhabitants and 650 homes, located in the territory of the **Socio-healthy superblock**. no. 1 of the valley (Image 3).

As part of the activity in the project, the Chair directing the **2021 Jinámar Valley Integral Plan Congress**, with the purpose of reflecting on the relationship between health, urban planning, quality of life and the care developed by the organizations and institutions present and active in the Jinámar Valley in the health, education, social and socio-health fields (Annex 2).

2. Design and implementation of the Insular Health Conferences with the *semi face-to-face ECCA system of distance education for adults*. (2014).

Direction, of the training action "Innovating in health management for the territorialization of the III Health Plan of the Canary Islands", with the semi-face-to-face ECCA system through radio and internet. The objective was to establish a participatory training- and research-action process for the development of the participatory component of the III Health Plan of the Canary Islands through the development of the Insular Health Conferences. It participated 80 of the 105 basic health zones, the 9 hospitals, and the mental health and public health network; were trained120 monitors to dynamize the 91 groups and it was reached the participation of 1.029 people including professionals, health managers, citizens and municipal representatives. 3. - Seminars aimed at the analysis and promotion of South-South-North cooperation from the perspective of health as a basic social right.

3.1. - "Analysis of health policies in Africa from the Latin American and international experience". Brasilia 2007.

Organized by the UNITWIN-UNESCO Chair within the "XIV Congress of the International Association of Health Policy (IAHP) held in Salvador de Bahía, Brazil, with the collaboration of the Brazilian Association of Collective Health (ABRASCO), the Institute of Collective Health of the Federal University of Bahia and the National Confederation of Municipal Health Secretaries of Brazil.

3.2. - "Advanced Seminar, "Canary Islands as a platform for health cooperation with West Africa: a strategy to define". Gran Canaria June 17th and 18th. 2010.

There was a significant institutional support with the participation of the following organizations: International Spanish Agency for Cooperation and Development (AECID); Carlos III Institute of the Spanish Ministry of Health; Antwerp Institute of Tropical Medicine and Public Health; General Directorate for Development of the European Commission. The Health Ministries of Health from Mauritania and Senegal; representation of the United Nations Population Fund; the Oswaldo Cruz Foundation of Brazil; Thematic Health Forum of the World Social Forum as well as other scientific organizations of the Canary Islands.

Some conclusions and recommendations were collected, around a common strategic for global health agenda from the Canary Islands, in defense of the human and social right to health and social security in Africa. (See annex 6)

4. - Design and implementation of the Insular Health Conferences with the blended ECCA system of distance education for adults (2014).

The project "Innovating in health management for the territorialization of the III Health Plan of the Canary Islands" was developed with the *semi-face-to-face ECCA system* through radio and internet. The objective was to establish a participatory training- and research-action process for the development and management of its transposition to each of the 7 islands, to the 70% of the *basic health zones* and the 9 hospitals of the Canary Islands. A group of 120 monitors were trained to dynamize the 91 groups with a participation of 1.029 people including professionals, managers, citizens and municipal representatives. Year 2014.

b. - Cooperation with UNESCO

The singularity of the area of knowledge of the Chair, in the field of local health systems, has greatly guided our offer of activity from the more specialized perspective of the health sector, understood as a mode of life, socially determined and as a basic social right. This vision has led us to areas of social rights, education, culture, politics, ecology, defense of the environment or healthy urban planning, that are forming part of the space and interest of the Chair.

The commemoration of the "50th Anniversary of the Man and Biosphere Program (MaB) organized by the Vice-Rectorate for Internationalization in October 2021 with the presentations of the Biosphere Reserves of the Canary Islands and the UNITWIN-UNESCO Chairs of the ULPGC has been a stimulating impulse for the future of the Chairs in this university. The prospect of updating the agreement with the Government Health Department, with its School of Health and Social Services and the incorporation of the area of Food Systems and Nutrition to the Chair. In addition, with the programmed activity planned in the short term, with the Institute of Collective Health of the University of Lanús, we are sure that they will reinforce the Chair.

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c.- Collaborations with higher education institutions and other partners

The trajectory and competence of the professionals that make up the Chair, together with the experience of seminars and conferences held, constitute a clear manifestation of the strategy followed by the Chair to South-South-North cooperation, since its creation in 1998. In particular, the Advanced Seminar "Canary Islands as a platform for health cooperation with West Africa: a strategy to be defined" in 2010, still in force, expresses and bases the strong connection that exists from the Chair with countries in Latin America, Africa, Europe and Canary Islands as a Region as a bridge in the tricontinental relationship (Annex 3).

On the other hand, the new impetus of the Rector's Office of support generates confidence providing for the development of the scheduled activity of the Chairs in the short term. The prospect of updating the agreements with the Government Health Department including its School of Health and Social Services; with the Institute of Collective Health of the Lanús University together with the incorporation of the Food Systems and Nutrition area to the Chair`, we are sure that they will contribute to its strengthening.

d. - Challenges and remedial actions

a.- Insufficient basic budget allocation of the Chair to meet operating costs, conferences-meetings; trips to set up "seed" projects; scholarships or grants to support stays or training of technicians or undergraduate or postgraduate students.

Approach: Placing all the desire and interest, with great enthusiasm and creativity, with voluntarism, reducing aspirations, limiting expectations.

b.- The limitations or lack of capacity of the Chair itself to have created a team, having to depend, or having depended, in large part on personnel from the administrations of the health or university services but without connection with the Chair.

Approach: Hiring personnel for projects but without being able to ensure their stability or continuity and accepting to reduce fees to amounts that are sometimes insufficient.

c.- The retirement in 2015 of José J. O'Shanahan from the Canary Islands Health Service as coresponsible for the Chair, produces a change in the activity of the Chair by losing important support that was available through the existing collaboration agreement .

Approach: Earning the trust and obtaining the adherence of professionals and institutions that want the project and with a lot of effort.

The change in the way of managing is more necessary than ever for the formulation and implementation of the social, institutional and economic response that complexity and uncertainty challenges us and demands in this pandemic and post-pandemic scenario. It is proposed in introduction to a new way of explaining and situating oneself in action of doing planning process.

Training activity:

- "Policy, planning, management and government in public institutions in the social field." 40 hours. Annual Periodicity. Execution period: Start in February 2022.
- Creation of a program for the exchange and training of professionals in a format of stay between 10 days and a maximum of 10 weeks, in <u>reference centers</u> of integrated health and social care and socio- sanitary services. Located in the Canary Islands Firstly, and countries of the UNITWIN network in the second terms, for the development of training in action, in accredited and/or organized services with the Chair and participating centers. Execution period 2023-2026.
- Realization of <u>technical assistance projects</u> on performance evaluation or action plans for problems in the different spheres, technical assistance levels of the services, systems and social health, social, socio-sanitarian and university administrations.
 e).- Student mobility and exchanges;
- Rehabilitate the agreement with the Agostinho Neto University of Angola, and in particular with the public health department of its Faculty of Medicine, and the Ideo Foundation of the Government of the Canary Islands, for the mobility exchange of Health Sciences students.
- Manage to promote postgraduate specialization, within the area of human sciences, in particular with areas of knowledge of Urban Planning and Health.

- <u>Citizenship and health program</u>. Format s of conferences, round tables and workshops of between 2 and 12 hours. The aim is raising awareness and contributing to the training of the participants to promote the formation of a critical citizen mass, in a movement for the

promotion of quality of life and better knowledge of the organization and operation of public health services and socio-sanitary and social care, as a universal, integrated, participatory, democratic, sustainable and more humane model. Execution period: November-December 2022.

- Promote the development of the <u>second Insular Health Conferences</u> in a Canary Islands Health Conference. Period: before the end of the year 2025.
- Round table: Shopping Basket and Food System in the Jinámar Valley. Completion period 2023.

d. Reflections

The Chair has made an important journey and accumulated interesting experience throughout its 24 years of history, having managed to reach a degree, type and place in the field of accumulated scientific and technical production that is not very easy to achieve. At this time, the possibility of its non-renewal, given the very good conditions established by the current government team of this University of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, would mean a high cost- opportunity for these Universities and, humbly, also for the UNESCO family.

We have gone through difficult times and the absence of visibility of the Chair has been largely related to the concentration of its activity in the development of two great experiences of high value for their transfer to international cooperation for development. On the one hand, the scientific and technical-political management of a health plan managed in situations of uncertainty, political and institutional instability, going through two very deep global crises. On the other hand, due to the transposition to the Canary Islands and to Europe, the transposition of the interesting Latin American experience of the strategic planning approach and, particularly from Brazil, its National Health Conferences. An interesting social and scientific capital to continue working in the UNITWIN-UNESCO network.

(Added: In general terms: How are we going to strengthen the Chair?

- Proposing to UNESCO, changing the current name of the UNITWIN-UNESCO Chair in Research,
 Planning and Development of Local Health Systems by the "UNITWIN-UNESCO Chair of Local Health Systems and Food Systems".
- Consolidating the space of the UNITWIN-UNESCO Chair as an actor in the training of health professional and health promotion.
- Continuing the training of citizens for their involvement in health promotion and democratic and participatory governance services.
- The training of directive cadres for innovation in planning and management of local health and food systems.
- Promoting the incorporation of the principles and objectives of the structuring cooperation in global health, from the UNESCO Chair, in a strategy of triangulation South-South-North cooperation, using the status of the Canary Islands as Ultraperiferic Region of Europe.
